Equipment and supplies needed per individual for plastic only:

1 sheet shrink plastic, any color (available at Michaels, Hobby Lobby in the kids' crafts section)

Craft scissors

1 sheet fine sandpaper

Small paintbrush

For jewelry:

Chain (links must be large enough for head pin to pass through)

Head pins

Beads

Round nose and chain nose pliers

Wire cutters

Equipment and supplies needed per table:

Newspaper or plastic tablecloth (sanding is messy)

Paper plates (for painting)

Acrylic paints (metallic looks best)

Embossing heat tool or blow dryer *If you have a heating tool, please bring it.*

Hole punch

Rubber stamp(s) with thick lines and little or no fine detail

Cookie sheet and hot pads or other surface for heating

Sharp tool to hold plastic in place while heating (scissors, skewer, we used wooden chopsticks)

General instructions:

Lightly sand both sides of one sheet of plastic so paint will adhere (don't leave any shiny spots)

Cut out shapes (they will shrink to approximately 1/3 their size)

Punch a hole at the top of each piece

Set up the heating equipment

Have a friend hold down the plastic with a sharp tool through the hole

Heat the plastic and immediately stamp the plastic as soon as you stop the heat (you really only have a split second before it hardens). This is just to give it texture; the placement of the stamp doesn't matter.

Paint the plastic on one side, let it dry, and paint the other.

Assemble the jewelry (optional).
