Working with Starter Strips by Teresa Salas and Pat Volkening

Technique: Odd Count Flat Peyote

Level: Beginner

To be learned/strengthened:

Create a Starter Strip to use for starting flat peyote

Supplies:

- Delicas or beads of size that will be used for peyote: 2 or 3 colors main color with offsetting color to designate 5th and 10th beads quantity will depend upon how long you want the starter strip to be, plan on 3 5 rows of the length you want your starter strip to be.
 - For instance, if you want a starter strip to use to start pen wraps, it must be a minimum of 46 beads wide (so... 50 x 3 = minimum 150 beads)

You're starting a peyote project. Have you struggled with those first three rows or so with any of the following?

- The tension isn't good
- o The first two rows twist as you're trying to add the third row
- It's difficult to follow the graph and properly place the beads for the first 2 rows


Enter the use of starter strips. A starter strip can be used over and over again to start your projects with consistent tension and allowing you to add each row individually. Teresa and Pat will show you how to create and use your starter strip.


Now that you have a starter strip, how about a project to use it with? When we were working with pen wraps a couple months ago, Teresa put pencil to paper and worked out our logo. So....







Comment: Easy and elegant using classic chevron/netting techniques and 4mm and 6mm Glass Pearls, 4mm Fire Polish Crystals, Size 11/0 and 8/0 seed beads. Create this beautiful collar necklace. Kit makes up to a 22" necklace. Comes in five great color combinations.

Comment: Delicate, yet not as hard as you think! This bracelet is a lovely accent to just about anything. Sparkly 4mm Fire Polish Crystals and 4mm Glass Pearls makes it a little more delicate design with plenty of bling!

Comment: This was fun to make! Talk about sparkle and motion. The picture just doesn't do it justice, the beads don't lay flat, they look like fluttery butterfly wings with sparkle!

Comment: Great beginner design that doesn't look like it's easy but it is! This fun design can be made in a variety of colors using 6mm Fire Polish Crystal and Size 11 Seed Beads.

Evening Star



Comment: Talk about twinkle, twinkle little star! This one will shine anywhere! It has a bold elegance and yet it's not too heavy. It uses 6mm, 4mm, Size 11, Size 6, and Size 8 Seed Beads. Using the 6mm Crystals for the closure gives the bracelet a nice uniform look, though it can be a bit fiddly to get on and off - you can always add a traditional clasp instead.


